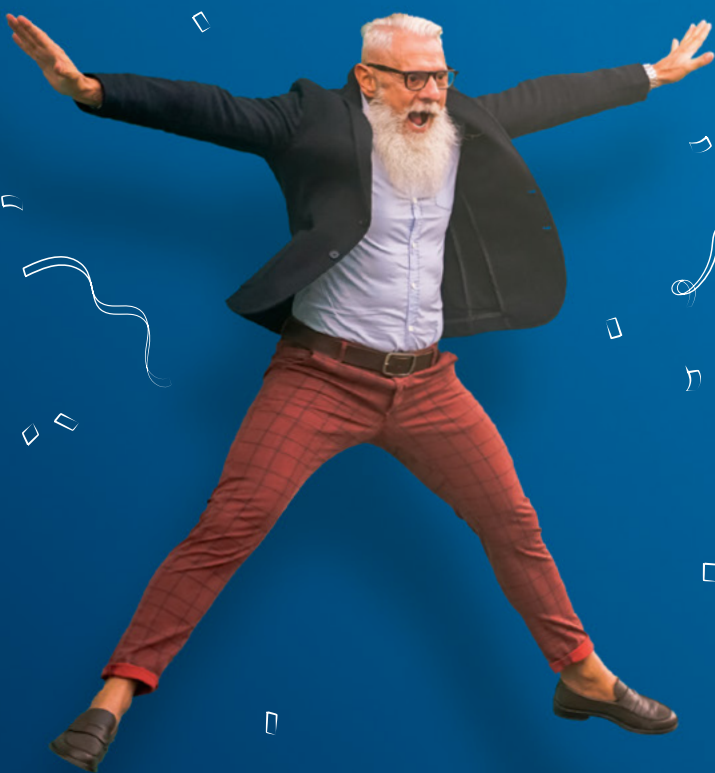

The freedom of implant-supported prosthetics

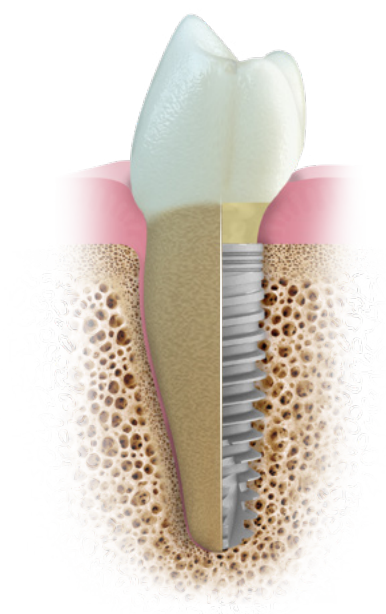

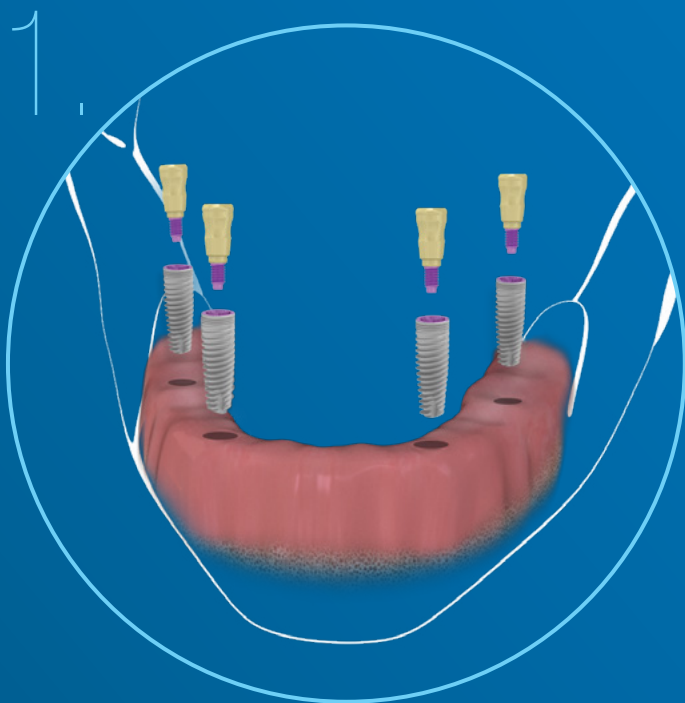
Dental implants are an effective solution for the restoration of a completely toothless jaw. Placing four or more implants as a base supporting a removable restoration is the ultimate solution for those who wish to improve comfort, speech, chewing, and quality of life.

What are dental implants?

Dental implants replace missing roots, and support dental restorations that look and feel just like your own teeth. You will be able to eat and drink whatever you like without the inconveniences of removable dentures or missing teeth.

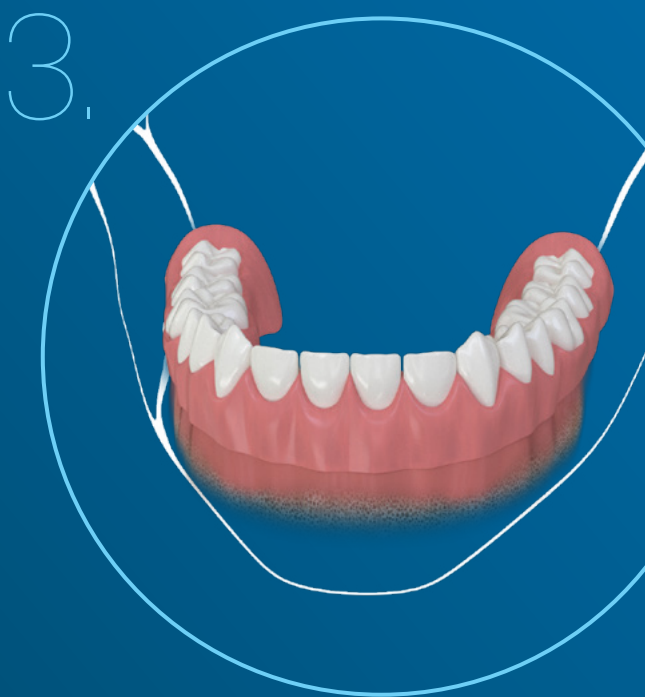
Dental implants have added benefits to other treatment options as they do not compromise healthy teeth and can help maintain bone health.



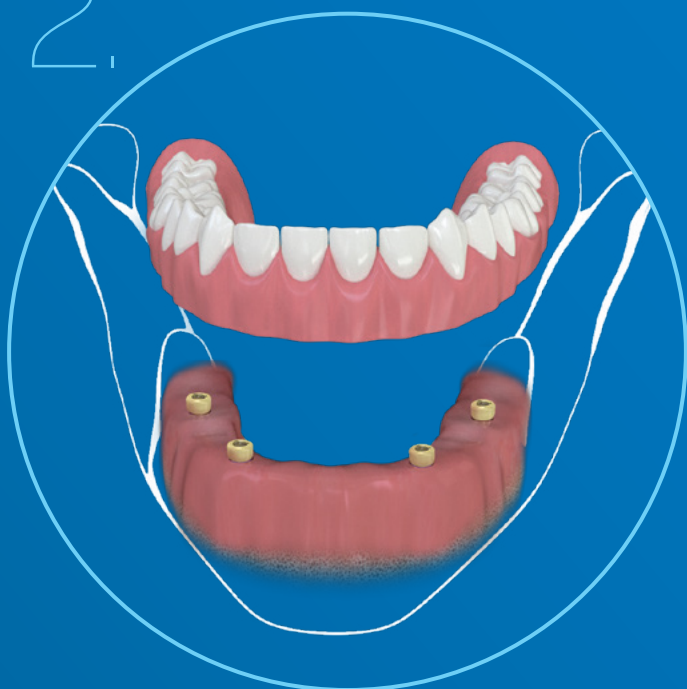


Implant placement including attachment system

Implants are placed into the patient's bone. After an appropriate healing period, prosthetic components are assembled.

Prosthetic preparation

The prosthetic is prepared, and retention is adjusted using plastic caps according to the placed implants. These caps need to be replaced by the dentist twice a year on average, during a short visit.

Delivery of prosthesis

Final adjustments are made to provide optimal comfort and retention for the patient.

Easier to maintain good oral hygiene



Greatly improves chewing



Eliminates the use of denture adhesives
